VANCOUVER, September 5, 2006 – The GolfBC fore S.U.C.C.E.S.S. 2nd annual charity golf tournament to be held on Tuesday, September 5, 2006, at Mayfair Lakes Golf & Country Club in Richmond is aimed to raise \$100,000. Organized by S.U.C.C.E.S.S. Foundation, the event is to increase funding for programs to benefit seniors, youths, women and families in need of language training and health education.

130 community-minded golfers and guests have signed up to support and compete in the tournament and various contests. The event will start at 10:30 am with advice on golf-related sport therapy for the participants. An open golf clinic will be directed by CPGA professionals to ensure that players are ready to compete in a putting contest held before the start of the tournament. After enjoying a light lunch, the Tee-Off Ceremony will be hosted by Mr. Lawrence Woo, Chairman of S.U.C.C.E.S.S. Foundation, Mrs. Linda Wong and Mr. Danny Gaw, Co-Chairs of the tournament.

The importance of community programs to give back to society and to improve the lives of those who are in need is being highlighted by Mr. Woo. Mrs. Wong and Mr. Gaw wish to thank the tournament sponsors – including the Chan Foundation of Canada, ASPAC Developments Ltd., and Bell Canada – for their generous support.

The tournament features a Texas Scramble format to encourage teamwork and enjoyment among the participants. The golfers will be given a series of opportunities to ace four par-3 holes to win a Cadillac STS, a Pontiac Solstice and Nike golf gear. Vehicles are generously provided by General Motors of Canada. Players can also try to eagle two holes for \$5,000 cash prizes. Throughout the course many holes will feature games, refreshments and prizes to be won.
